From the Pastor's Pen

In his book "Making Sense of the Church" theologian Wayne Grudem describes the church as being "invisible, yet visible". What he means by that is that the visible church is the church as Christians (and everybody else too) on earth see it. In this sense, the visible church includes all who profess faith in Christ and give evidence of that faith in their lives. It can be, and often is a real mess! But the invisible church is the church as God sees it. It is full of life, filled with beauty, and a reflection of God Himself.

At Robinhood Road Baptist Church, we're always trying our very best to do our part to make sure the visible church is as accurate reflection of the invisible church as we can help it become. Part of that includes loving the neighbor, welcoming the stranger, and extending our hand of fellowship to all who may come our way. And our present reality is that 292 families will be moving into apartments within walking distance of our campus in the next few months.

Because of this, and our growing attendance over the last few years, our church leadership has been praying about what to do and how to create much needed space for people whom we have not yet met, but will have the opportunity to love. As much as we love the warmth and spirit in our sanctuary when we are all together, we're beginning to realize that our only option may be to begin offering two worship services on Sunday mornings.

Right now, I just want to ask you to be praying about this. Your staff is working hard behind the scenes to make sure that if we make this change, we'll be able to do it successfully. At our May business meeting, we will have an open discussion about it, and ultimately let the church family decide if you want to take this step via casting a vote whether or not this is something you feel like is in the best interest of our congregation. IF we move forward, we will likely begin having an 8:30AM service on Sunday mornings in late July.

I share all of this with you because it is not a secret, nor should it be something only a few of us are praying about. It's a big step, and we want it bathed in prayer and we want everyone's voice to be heard. So now you know. Your next job is to pray, then vote. And finally, your job will be to support and participate as we try to create the same spirit in 2 services that we currently have in one.

It's a great privilege being your pastor and friend. Thank you for being who you are, doing what you do, and loving your church the way you do!

I find it interesting to learn the origin of songs that we sing. I think the Lord uses unique circumstances to give us the hymns and gospel songs of our faith. In the book "Al Smith's Treasury of Hymn Histories" (By Alfred B. Smith), an account is given of a gentleman who began to visit the Pacific Garden Mission in Chicago, Illinois. He would come in inebriated over a period of several nights. He was different from those who usually visited the mission, though, and it soon became known that he was a professional entertainer struggling between bookings.

Mr. and Mrs. Walter Taylor were running the mission and began to pray for him. One evening, he participated more in the singing and was attentive to the message given in the service. At an invitation at the close of the service, "Mac" responded. Mrs. Taylor overheard him at the altar saying "But you don't understand, you don't know how bad I am, Lord. Really, I'm the worst man in the world. You can't save me. I'm too bad." Mrs. Taylor began to share with Mac how all sins of his past were covered by the blood of Jesus. As he realized this truth for the first time, Mac exclaimed "Calvary does cover it all, my whole past of sin and shame!"

That night, Walter MacDonald "Mac" became a new creature in Christ and would leave the world of entertainment to become a soul winning evangelist. Mrs. Taylor, recalling Mac's response, sat down later that week and wrote the words "Calvary covers it all, my past with its sin and stain. My guilt and despair. Jesus took on Him there and Calvary covers it all." She penned 4 stanzas with this chorus which tell the gospel story of the complete work of Christ on the cross to provide all-inclusive payment for all sin by His blood.
