#### From the Pastor's Pen

What does a healthy church look like? Well that's a loaded question if ever one has been asked! If you go to seminary, you'll learn all about how the church has five functions (worship, evangelism, prayer, fellowship, and discipleship) and that a church that is well balanced in all five areas is healthy. If you ask the typical church member, their answer might depend on how they feel about their church staff and what sort of job they think the pastor is doing. If you ask the "seasoned" church goer, you might get a statement like I got once. A very wise church member once told me "you can tell if a church is healthy by how full the pews and the offering plates are". And then there are the visitors......who look for all sorts of things in determining what kind of church you have. Years ago, I was once told by a visitor that they could not worship with us because the rose bushes outside really needed some attention, and they just couldn't get past it as they walked in!

So instead of trying to define "what makes a church healthy" this month I think I'll take a crack at simply making an observation about what I witnessed last week at RRBC. Between the time we left after prayer meeting on Wednesday night and when we regathered for worship on Sunday morning, the following things took place:

 A deacon was standing in the living room of a church member at 4:50AM to pray with them before surgery that morning.

- 2. 25 or so women gathered for a ladies Bible study.
- 65 community families heard the gospel at our Preschool's Spring program.
- Our Bereavement committee took care of a grieving family.
- A single mother in our community was kept from homelessness thanks to our church benevolence fund.
- 17 of us spent 6 hours Friday evening learning about and praying for the church in North Korea.
- A lone member spent his Saturday morning pulling weeds from our flowerbeds and making the outside of our building beautiful.
- Our mission crafters met and made pillows for the dialysis center and other items to be donated to various ministries in our community.
- Sunday morning, as they always do, our deacons met with the pastor before services and prayed for the Lord's presence and for the movement of the Holy Spirit throughout the day.

I don't dare to try to say whether we are a "healthy church" or not...but I know this, God is doing some amazing things both for and through our church family and continues to provide us with opportunity after opportunity to be the light of our community.

Thank you for being a part of that. It's a real privilege and joy to be your pastor.

I'm sure many of us are thankful for and have cherished memories of our mothers who God used to provide us with physical life. This causes me to think of the passage in John 3:1-7 where Jesus has a conversation with Nicodemus. Jesus explains to him the need to be "born again" by the power of the Holy Spirit or one is not able to see the Kingdom of God (vs. 3).

This passage of scripture is the basis for an old hymn written in the late 1800's by George C. Stebbins, the music man of an evangelistic team organized and sent out by D.L. Moody. Knowing the importance and effectiveness of the Gospel message set to music, Mr. Stebbins was able to adjust some of the words spoken by Jesus and fit them into a musical tune. This song was soon published and used to compliment the preaching of God's Word and spread the Gospel across the country!
